









Linear top down model of INNOVATION




How do iNets work?


Involving key stakeholders (value chain positions)

What type of challenges?

A participatory process establishes **priorities** for each iNet. Priorities can relate to all aspects of the value chain.

- Production forest management & collection
- Transformation processing & transformation
- Trade local, domestic and export
- Integration of products and services (multifunctional forestry, nature-based tourism)

Particular attention is drawn to cross-cutting sectorial issues, such as

- Innovative business models and value chains
- Access to finance and market intelligence
- New applications of **digital tools**
